What we offer: We are able to facilitate museum lessons of whatever current exhibition is on at the national gallery during the time of your booking. Participants are introduced to different artworks and concepts that encourage critical and creative thinking. Learners can be provided with a worksheet (on request), which allows for interaction with the exhibitions independently. We are also able to provide a practical art activity for learners to complete in the Annexe or Gallery (capacity dependant). Activities can be continued and completed in the classroom.
